If you have questions about your program and its use of these time blocks, please contact your program's assistant director.


Cross-Registration

Like HGSE course registration, cross-registration into any of the other Harvard schools and MIT is done through my.Harvard. Please note that classes at other Harvard Schools start as early as Monday,

August 28 and cross-registration may have already

started. Please take a few moments to review the <u>cross-registration process</u> with other schools at Harvard. Also, visit our <u>Cross-Registration</u> page for additional information.

Please note that credits and units vary among schools; to determine the amount of credits a cross-registered course will count for at HGSE, click on the Credit Conversion tool on my. Harvard Course Search Tab. Similarly, Harvard schools and MIT have different registration deadlines and start dates; to determine such dates, click on the Cross-Registration Dates tool. Finally, if you are considering cross-registering at MIT, we highly recommend doing so during the Fall Term; during the Spring Term, MIT starts classes later than HGSE and at times our add/drop deadline is earlier than their open registration date.

Grade Options & Letter Grade Policy

Students are expected to indicate their grade option (letter grade or satisfactory/no credit) for each course selected at course enrollment. As you plan out your course of study for the year (or for two years if part-time), please keep in mind that, in general, Ed.M. students must take at least 16 credits for a letter grade.

Please note that cross-registered courses taken for letter grades (e.g., A, B, C, D, and E or F) count toward this minimum. Cross-registered courses taken satisfactory/no credit (or the equivalent option at the host School) **do not.** Grades issued through cross-registration are recorded as such and are not converted by HGSE. These are the schools that offer Letter Grade courses: **Divinity, FAS, Business School Doctorate, HKS, Public Health, and MIT.**
