### **Course Updates**

## **Credit Limit**

As you finalize your enrollment, please note that:

- Full-time students may take no more than 20 credits per semester (Spring full-term, spring 1, and spring 2).
- Part-time students may take no more than 10 credits per semester (Spring full-term, spring 1, and spring 2).
- Please note that during the spring semester you also need to keep track of your overall 56 max credit count. The credits count taken/enrolled in summer, fall, and spring (including August, January, and May Terms) cannot exceed the overall 56 max credit count.

### **Grade Options & Letter Grade Policy**

Students are expected to indicate their grade option (letter grade or satisfactory/no credit) for each course selected at course enrollment. As you plan out your course of study for the year (or for two years if part-time), please keep in mind that, in general, Ed.M. students must take at least 16 credits for a letter grade.

Cross-registration: Please note that cross-registered courses taken for letter grades (e.g., A, B, C, D, and E or F) count toward this minimum. Cross-registered courses taken satisfactory/no credit (or the equivalent option at the host School) do not. Grades issued through cross-registration are recorded as such and are not converted by HGSE. These are the schools that offer Letter Grade courses: Divinity, FAS, Business School Doctorate, HKS, Public Health, and MIT.
